IV. Old Business

A. Program Manager Updates

Heather Wheeler provided activity updates since the meeting in March. Those updates included:

- Loudoun Equine Alliance Horse Expo April 12 The Program Manager attended the Expo and setup and staffed an exhibit table for VHIB. The exhibit featured flyers and brochures from grant recipients for upcoming events and information on the VHIB Marketing Grant. The information was well received by Expo attendees and served as a conversation starter for attendees to ask questions about the organizations and events. The Program Manager also visited each exhibitor and provided them information on VHIB and its Marketing Grant.
- Equine Organizations and Associations The Program Manager has
 continued to reach out to Virginia-based organizations and associations via
 phone and email to introduce them to VHIB and its grant program. These
 contacts have also provided an opportunity to discuss opportunities and
 challenges being faced by the industry.

- Marketing Grants The Program Manager has continued to work with equine organizations and venues interested in applying for a marketing grant and has helped them understand the process, the application and offered editing assistance as well.
- Virginia High School Rodeo Association Finals The Program Manager attended the VHSRA Finals May 28 to meet the competitors, their families and the volunteers and to represent VHIB and VDACS and provide information on the services we provide to the industry.
- Equine Events and Shows The Program Manager encouraged the Board to attend events in their area and meet with the competitors/participants. These events are excellent opportunities to hear directly from the horse industry and learn more about the activities going on around the state. The Program Manager told Board Members that VHIB decals, sunglasses, etc. could be shipped from the Richmond Office to their location within a week so that Board Members could have them when attending the events.

B. Virginia Tech Grants

a. Virginia Tech – At the December meeting, the Board had not received any requests for extensions for the outstanding projects with Virginia Tech so the Board decided to conclude the grants and to request all outstanding invoices from Virginia Tech by January 31, 2022. The Program Manager communicated the deadline to the Office of Sponsored Programs and the invoices were not provided until February 2, 2022 past the deadline. The invoices are missing some information and the Office of Sponsored Programs had not responded to requests for clarification as of March 14, 2022. The Board approved a motion at the March 14, 2022 meeting to terminate the relationship with Virginia Tech and not reimburse the invoices received after the deadline. The Program Manager was contacted on or around June 9, 2022 by the Senior Director Post Award of VT's Office of Sponsored Program who requested that VHIB reconsider paying the invoices and reconsider providing grant funding to their researchers. The Senior Director provided letters of apology and missing grant reports from the researchers. The Board discussed the request and the past several years of Virginia Tech being habitually poor at following guidelines, providing reports and timely invoices. The Board discussed the fact that they don't feel Virginia Tech has provided any return on the grant funding they received for VHIB or the horse industry as a whole. After discussion, K. Foltman motioned that the Board would reluctantly pay the invoices that Virginia Tech sent after the deadline and that VHIB would terminate all relationships with Virginia Tech as it has been too difficult to receive follow-up, reports and invoices. O. Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
